

Present Perfect Tense

Affirmative Sentences

- Soon after the subject. Put helping verb has or have according to subject.
- Then secondly, use the third form of verb.
- With he, she, it, or singular noun use 'has' and with I, we, they, you use 'have'.

Subject	+	Helping verb	+	3 rd form of verb	+	Object
He	+	has	+	taken	+	tea
I	+	have	+	taken	+	tea
It	+	has	+	taken	+	tea
She	+	has	+	taken	+	tea
They	+	have	+	taken	+	tea
We	+	have	+	taken	+	tea
You	+	have	+	taken	+	tea
Ali	+	has	+	taken	+	tea

Present Perfect Tense

Negative Sentence

- In negative sentences of this tense, put 'not' after suitable helping verb and then 3rd form of verb.

Subject	+	Helping verb	+	3 rd form of verb	+	Object
He	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
I	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
It	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
She	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
They	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
We	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
You	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea
Ali	+	has not	+	taken	+	tea

Present Perfect Tense

Interrogative Sentence

- In negative sentences of this tense, put 'not' after suitable helping verb and then 3rd form of verb.

Helping verb	+	Subject		3 rd form of verb	+	Object
has	+	he		taken	+	tea
has	+	I		taken	+	tea
has	+	it		taken	+	tea
has	+	she		taken	+	tea
has	+	they		taken	+	tea
has	+	we		taken	+	tea
has	+	you		taken	+	tea
has	+	Ali		taken	+	tea

Present Perfect Tense

Affirmative Examples

- He has done his homework.
- She has washed the clothes.
- The rain has stopped.
- You have helped us.

Negative Examples

- He has not taken breakfast.
- She has not combed her hair.
- You have not taken breakfast.
- They have not taken breakfast.

Interrogative Examples

- Has he won the match?
- Has he washed the clothes?
- Have they read the story?
- Have they changed the clothes?
